
2017 MLK, Jr. Commemoration Executive Director Application



SAVE THE DATE! The 2017 MLK, Jr. Commemoration will be January 16-20, 2017!

Description of the Commemoration:

On November 2, 1983, former President Ronald Reagan signed into law House of Representatives Bill Number 3706 declaring January 15, the birthday of Martin Luther King, Jr., a national holiday.

In December 1985, former Penn State President Bryce Jordan formed a President's planning committee for Martin Luther King, Jr. recognition. Dr. James B. Stewart, director of the Black Studies Program at that time, served as the inaugural chair. The official recognition of this holiday began in 1986, and occurs on the third Monday in January each year.

Today, the MLK, Jr. Commemoration at Penn State is made possible by a dedicated group of students, faculty/staff, donors, and units across the university. This year's student sub-committee will be comprised of an executive director, administrative director and director(s) of Sponsorship, Public Relations, Communications, Community Outreach, Faculty/Staff Outreach, Campus Events, Day of Service and Evening Celebration. Qualifications of Directors:

ALL Penn State-University Park students are eligible to apply. We want students who are passionate and have had a significant Leadership experience in the past.

Expectations of Executive Director:

The MLK, Jr. Student Directors will be expected to commit to a year-long position, although the peak work time will be April - February. Selection of new committee members will begin by the end of each Spring Semester, and committee members will be expected to serve through the following Spring Semester. Directors are also expected to keep in touch during the summer months and be equal participants in all of the events of the Commemoration, as it takes a team to make the Commemoration a success!

The Executive Director is expected to oversee all operations, planning and execution of the entire MLK, Jr. Commemoration week of events. Some of those duties include developing materials to help new Directors transition into the position, coordinating and delegating tasks to each respective Director on the Executive Committee, resolving all issues that arise, supporting each of the Directors and events as they need help, and acting as a source of creativity and information for Directors. The Executive Director is also responsible for leading weekly meetings, meeting weekly with the Advisor, and ensuring effective communication and coordination between all Directors on the Executive Committee.
